This notice is further to an application, received on May 3, 2023, requesting a scope ruling in regards to certain carbon steel fasteners (fasteners) originating in or exported from the People's Republic of China (China) and the Separate Customs Territory of Taiwan, Penghu, Kinmen and Matsu (Chinese Taipei). The Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) has reviewed the application and has today initiated a scope proceeding with respect to the goods that are the subject of the application.

The proceeding has been initiated pursuant to subsection 63(8) of the *Special Import Measures Act* (SIMA). Notice of the initiation of the scope proceeding is hereby given pursuant to section 65 of SIMA.

This scope proceeding relates to the Canadian International Trade Tribunal's (CITT) order issued on September 2, 2020 in Expiry Review No. RR-2019-002, respecting the dumping of fasteners originating in or exported from China and Chinese Taipei and the subsidizing of certain carbon steel fasteners, originating in or exported from China. The information collected during the course of this scope proceeding will be used to determine whether the goods in question fall within the product description of the CITT finding referenced above. It is expected that the scope proceeding will be concluded by September 29, 2023.
